NOTICE OF DISMISSAL – DODGE RAM (CATALYST SYSTEMS) PROPOSED CLASS ACTION

Read this notice carefully. It may affect your legal rights.

Persons in Canada who own, owned, lease or leased certain diesel-powered Dodge RAM heavy duty pick-up trucks, model years 2007-2012, are advised that:

A proposed class action commenced on December 23, 2016 against FCA Canada Inc., FCA US LLC, Cummins Eastern Canada LP, and Cummins Inc. (collectively "**FCA and Cummins**") in the Ontario Superior Court of Justice was <u>dismissed</u> by Order of the Court on December 7, 2022.

The proposed class proceeding alleged that FCA and Cummins equipped the following diesel-powered Dodge RAM vehicles with illegal defeat devices which caused the trucks to consume more fuel and emit higher levels of pollutants than advertised and allowed by law, as well as causing the catalytic converter to fail prematurely: (i) 2007-2010 Dodge RAM 2500 or 3500 (2WD, 4WD); and (ii) 2011-2012 Dodge RAM 2500 or 3500 (non-SCR systems, 2WD, 4WD).

FCA and Cummins deny these allegations.

You are receiving this notice because you previously inquired with Siskinds LLP ("**Siskinds**") in respect of this class action.

Siskinds is of the opinion that this proposed class proceeding is no longer viable, and the representative plaintiff no longer wishes to pursue the claim against FCA and Cummins. On this basis, Siskinds sought and obtained the approval of the Ontario Superior Court of Justice to dismiss the proposed class proceeding.

If you were relying on this proceeding to protect your rights, you should consult your own lawyer immediately.

TAKE NOTICE that any applicable limitation periods for bringing any potential claim regarding the issues raised in this proceeding was suspended upon the commencement of this action and has resumed upon its dismissal on December 7, 2022. On the expiry of the limitation period, if there is any time left within it, any right you may have to sue over these matters may be extinguished. If you wish to pursue a court claim regarding Dodge RAM defeat devices, there are steps you should take before the applicable limitation period expires. Limitation periods vary across Canada, so seek legal advice from local counsel.
