Notable Work and Decisions

Deboer v Dr. D M Kolyn et al

In a decision released December 23, 2016, Justice Morissette of the Ontario Superior Court of Justice determined that the Defendant radiologist and Defendant general surgeon had breached the standard of care in delaying the diagnosis of the Plaintiff's breast cancer. Justice Morissette determined that but for the Defendants' negligence, the Plaintiff would not be suffering from cancer metastases in her bones and would not die prematurely from this disease.
